The perfect pairing of world-class

wine and gorgeous landscapes

beckons travelers to Sonoma

County and Napa Valley.

Perhaps the United States' most famous wine-growing region, the neighboring wine countries of **Napa** and **Sonoma** promise the pleasure and relaxation that make the area so renowned.

To get around, renting a convertible to be surrounded by the stunning scenery is one way to go. Or, to truly focus on the wines and beauty, leave the driving to **Pure Luxury**, which transports visitors in style. Its Exclusive Sommelier **Tour** is an in-depth exploration of wine country, including wineries in hidden destinations, boutique wineries specializing in limited-release bottles, historic vineyards, and much more.

Across the region, superb dining options abound, with 16 restaurants and cafés receiving Michelin recognition. Also, many wineries offer excellent dining where you can gaze across the vineyards while enjoying a memorable lunch.



DAYS 1 + 2 NAPA VALLEY

On vineyard-lined routes including Napa's Silverado Trail, visitors share the delights unfolding around them. Amid the wineries and endlessly photogenic valleys is the unmissable town of Napa, with its walkable urban vibe. The dozens of diversions here range from coffeehouses and galleries to shops and wine-tasting rooms. One such destination for sampling local vintages is Vintner's Collective. Nearby, Clos du Val features panoramic views alongside pours of its fruit-forward cabernet sauvignons and Bordeaux-inspired blends. The sunny patio is hard to leave.

Going north up the valley, Yountville is surrounded by rolling fields of grapevines. Be sure to reserve a table far ahead at the French Laundry, a destination perennially awarded three Michelin stars, for the meal of a lifetime. Lauded for its Poetry cabernet sauvignon, Cliff Lede Vineyards is an art-filled estate.

Spend a leisurely day visiting the wineries in rural **Rutherford**. **Caymus Vineyards** is known for its classic Napa-style cabernet sauvignon and beautiful stone-walled winery. **Quintessa** produces cabernet sauvignon, merlot, cabernet

franc, petit verdot, and carmenère grapes—all farmed organically.

Close to St. Helena. a town in the heart of the Napa wine region where it's easy to get around on two feet, Alila Napa Valley has an intimate collection of rooms and suites surrounded by historic wineries, including the vaunted vines of **Beringer Vineyards.** Relax on a private balcony or terrace, some with personal firepits. For some of the valley's best merlot, head to **Duckhorn**, where tastings take place on its wrap-around veranda.



DAYS 3 + 4 SONOMA COUNTY

Head west into Sonoma County where the rolling hills bordering the Napa Valley become ever more green as you explore the Russian River Valley and continue on to the Pacific Ocean.

Just north of charming, historic Sonoma, the mannered Fairmont Sonoma Mission Inn & Spa hosts guests in an elegant mission-style resort. Nearby, Hanzell Vineyards produces a California chardonnay that wins raves from everyone who tastes it.

West of **Santa Rosa** and its compact downtown shopping district, the Russian River Valley holds alluring towns and is awash in excellent





wineries. Near a river bend in Forestville, the Farmhouse Inn has a rich history as a working ranch. Proprietors (and siblings) Joe and Catherine Bartolomei's hotel incorporates a Michelin-starred restaurant and myriad nods to comfort such as the 24-hour pool.

Westside Road wends through undulating fields of grapes fringed with lavender. It leads to **Healdsburg**, beloved for culinary gems that

encircle the central square. Book ahead for the Michelin three-star SingleThread. Local wineries of note include Truett Hurst, a lovely spot to sip a glass of punchy zinfandel and a model of sustainable viticulture. Flowers Vineyards has one of the region's most attractive tasting rooms, which isnaturally-set amid fields of flowers.

Further west is the Pacific Ocean and en route lies magnificence not found in Italy, France, or anywhere else on the planet-Steinbeck celebrated the soaring trees of California's coastal redwood groves for their "silence and awe." Stand in wonder at **Armstrong Redwoods State Natural Reserve** iust north of the village of **Guerneville**. Continue up the Pacific Coast Highway (a.k.a. PCH or Highway 1), stopping to sample superbly fresh oysters and crab.

AN ABUNDANCE OF ACCOMMODATION OPTIONS

In addition to the properties mentioned above, Northern California's wine country has a wealth of fabulous places to stay that cater to every taste, mood, and whim. Stylish choices include Meadowood Napa Valley in St. Helena and Carneros Resort and Spa, set within a passel of wineries west of Napa.

HIGH SIERRA

Road-trip through the Sierra Nevada from Lake Tahoe to Mammoth Lakes, where the raw beauty accents luxurious style.

HIGH SIERRA ADVENTURES

The High Sierras beckon visitors in winter and summer, especially the brilliantly blue waters of **Lake Tahoe** and crystalline pools around **Mammoth Lakes**. It's a wonderland of great adventure in the great outdoors. The ski season can span three seasons, from fall through spring. Awesome hiking and superlative fishing are just two of the draws outside of winter. Adrenaline-fueled pursuits are limited only by the imagination.

Accommodations emphasize pampered and restful comfort, and the dining options promise memorable and hearty repasts after days out in the wilderness.



DAYS 1 + 2 NORTH LAKE TAHOE

Truckee, the delightful and historic town at the north end of the Lake Tahoe region, has a main street straight out of the 19th century, with trains whistling past as they've done since the completion of the first transcontinental railroad in 1869.

Surrounded by the jutting peaks south of Truckee, The Ritz-Carlton, Lake Tahoe is in the heart of Northstar California Resort, the vast skiing and outdoor adventure center on the slopes of Mount Pluto. Lifts run right from the hotel entrance, and a real pleasure awaits at the end of the day, thanks to fireplaces in every one of

the 170 rooms—reason enough for a deep dive into the room service menu.

Further south, Tahoe
Vista and Dollar Point
are but two of the string
of bucolic villages lining
the north shore of Lake
Tahoe. Rent a classic
lake cruiser made from
varnished wood and
explore the pine-treefringed shoreline. For
dinner, Christy Hill
in Tahoe City serves
French-inspired fare on
unbeatable lakefront
tables.

West of the lake, Olympic Valley lies at the base of the site of the 1960 Winter Olympics, where Palisades Tahoe is known for world-class activities year-round. In winter, over 177 ski runs

operate. Throughout all seasons, the recently opened base-to-base gondola connects Palisades to **Alpine**, the companion resort area over the mountain.

The Everline Resort and Spa's suites and penthouses make ideal retreats after a day of skiing or hiking. Or you might just hit the links on the resort's own golf course.

Nearby, the lifts are steps away from PlumpJack Inn. Its 56 rooms and intimate suites are within one of the world's most popular ski resorts. Catch the vibe around the outdoor pool or on the sunny deck at the neighboring Le Chamois, a welcoming bistro and bar.

The drive south along the meandering west side of Lake Tahoe is near impossible to traverse without frequent stops for some new vista of cerulean water, emerald-green forest, and silver-hued granite.

Following the crest of the Sierra south on Highway 395, the turn for the summer-only Tioga Pass Entrance to Yosemite National Park beckons.
Relatively few visitors take the route across the high Alpine

Spending the night in The Ahwahnee. the famous 1927 hotel, is a grand and memorable experience. And everywhere in Yosemite Valley, especially outside of popular summer months, embodies the pastoral promise described by John Muir, "Nature's peace will flow into you as sunshine flows into trees."

DAY 5 MAMMOTH LAKES

Mammoth Lakes present unforgettable vistas of indigo waters reflecting the High Sierra. Ride to the 11,053-foot summit of Mammoth Mountain and gaze out at the miles-long views. Here the ski season can last until July. The year-round trekking—by foot, mountain bike, or skis—is always first-rate. In summer, legendary fishing sites seem to populate every corner of the lake.

Named for the Indigenous Mono people, the Westin Monache Resort is ideally situated to take full advantage of this spectacular spot. Studios and suites include fireplaces and kitchens. The rustic Mogul Restaurant is known for its prime rib.



HIGH SIERRA HIGHLIGHTS

Have an exhilarating day whitewater rafting on the wild **Tuolumne River**, which flows through Yosemite National Park. Just east of Highway 395, the High Sierra's main road, **Mono Lake** offers stark beauty and magnificent serenity along its craggy shores.

CENTRAL COAST WINE COUNTRY



HUNDREDS OF WINERIES

Between **SLO CAL** (short for San Luis Obispo County, California) and Santa Barbara County—which includes the Santa Maria Valley, Santa Ynez Valley, and Lompoc Valley—there are over 500 wineries, making this part of the state an oenophile's dream. These fertile lands also yield remarkable produce and the region offers a compelling dining scene, including nearly 30 Michelin-honored restaurants.

And it's all easily accessible from either **Los Angeles** or the **Bay Area**, whether enjoying the famed views along Highway 1 or traveling along pastoral Highway 101.



PASO ROBLES

Cabernet and Rhône varietals largely share the spotlight in Paso Robles, but the rapidly developing appellation continues to foster new talent who seek out alternative styles. Explore the many wine routes weaving through the vine-laced countryside.

SLO CAL wineries work magic with some of the world's more esoteric grapes. One such estate is Giornata with a portfolio of wines made from native Italian varieties. Family-run Daou champions Bordeaux

grapes. Its elaborate Spanish-style tasting room treats winery visitors to sweeping hilltop views. In nearby **Templeton**, **Tin** City is the place to taste the creations of more than 40 boutique wineries and breweries. The Michelinstarred Six Test Kitchen serves seasonal tasting menus that pair the best local wines with dishes featuring regional flavors. For California fare at its finest in the town of Paso Robles, reserve ahead for the six-course tasting menu at in bloom.

And at night, check into The Piccolo, a fourstory boutique hotel with personalized service and a lovely lobby fireplace. Located in the walkable center of town, the property offers a grand top-floor suite and rooftop bar. Other well-appointed lodging choices include the central Hotel Cheval and Tuscaninspired Allegretto, set among vineyards. Also amid vines is Just Inn. On the grounds of the celebrated Justin Winery, the exclusive lodgings include three suites, a villa, and an entire four-bedroom chateau.

DAY 2

SAN LUIS OBISPO

The namesake heart of SLO CAL, San Luis Obispo lies at the crossroads of Highways 1 and 101. Just up the road to the north, along the coast of San Simeon, the legendary **Hearst Castle** embodies luxurious living at its zenith. Book a private tour, a fourhour, in-depth exploration of the opulent grounds and mansion covering many areas that aren't open to the public. Stop for an oceanfront tasting at the **Hearst Ranch** Winery. In Cambria, you can sample the renowned grenache rosé of Stolo Vineyards at its serene, petfriendly tasting room.

In SLO, the Mission San Luis Obispo de Tolosa dates to 1772. The modern Hotel Cerro nearby boasts a much sought-after penthouse. Also downtown are the contemporary Hotel SLO and the elegant, historic Granada Hotel & Bistro.

Among the top eateries in a destination full of exceptional restaurants, San Luis Obispo's **Buona Tavola** dishes up Italian specialties with local flair. Book a table on the covered garden patio. Before and after, stroll the downtown with its shops, galleries, and beloved Thursday evening **Farmers Market**.





DAY 3 SANTA YNEZ VALLEY

The **Santa Ynez Valley** is a delightfully rural region of family farms, boutique wineries, and timeless, walkable towns.

More than 50 tasting rooms line the charming streets of Los Olivos. Auberge Resorts Collection's The Inn at Mattei's Tavern is a new (and luxurious) lodge in an 1800s setting—think of it as modern agrarian bliss. Bar Le Côte looks to the Pacific Ocean for its Michelin-honored seafood dishes.

Nearby in **Los Alamos**, Michelin-starred **Bell's Restaurant** serves Frenchaccented bistro fare. Tables are reserved weeks in advance. Save time to stroll and sample the many winery tasting rooms. The village of **Santa Ynez** is another walkable gem with upscale shopping.

The adjoining Santa Maria Valley includes the legendary Bien Nacido Vineyards, which is famous for its French varietals. Presqu'ile Winery pairs tastings with a mezze picnic of foods from local purveyors. And over in the Lompoc Valley, sea breezes provide the perfect conditions for the chardonnays and pinot noirs at The Hilt Estate.


DAYS 4 + 5

SANTA BARBARA

Sun-kissed beach town meets stylish getaway in Santa Barbara with its sublime restaurants, refined architecture, Mediterranean lifestyle, fashionable boutiques, and magnificent gardens. It may be hard to leave the oceanfront suites at the mission-style Ritz-Carlton Bacara, which has a spa, multiple pools and restaurants, and paths to the beach. Steps away from the Santa Barbara waterfront, the glamorous Hotel Californian melds a Moorish vibe with modern comforts, from

the rooftop pool to suites with fireplaces.

Montecito, the exclusive enclave to the south, is home to the 500-acre San Ysidro Ranch, a fabled resort that dates to the 1890s and includes the vast suite where John and Jackie Kennedy once honeymooned. Nearby, Rosewood Miramar Beach is another top choice and features Caruso's, a Michelin-starred restaurant with beautiful ocean views.

DAY 1 FUN AT DISNEYLAND The international star of The OC for more than six decades is, of course, **Disneyland** in **Anaheim**. The original park is ever-changing with the recently added **Star Wars: Galaxy's Edge** as its latest sensation. Next door, Disney's **California Adventure** offers its own thrills. Avoid the crowds with an official VIP Tour Guide. You can skip the lines and get access to reserved seats at the parades, fireworks, and other shows.

Inside the Disneyland Resort, kids can enjoy a fanciful makeover into a princess or knight at the Bibbidi Bobbidi Boutique. Reserve well ahead. Right across from the park, the Westin Anaheim has suites with balconies and views of the Magic Kingdom. Recount the day's thrills and chills at the rooftop bar. The JW Marriott, Anaheim Resort features a pool deck with private cabanas and sofas for lounging. Top-floor suites have Disneyland views.

Although many nosh at the park, Anaheim has plentiful fine restaurants such as **The Ranch**, an exceptional steakhouse serving meats and produce grown on its own farm.







AND ART

FASHIONABLE OC

Huntington Beach is known for its historic pier extending 1,850 feet over the Pacific (one of the West Coast's longest) and surfing. For another quintessentially OC experience on the water, consider a yacht rental at Newport Harbor.

Just inland, **South Coast Plaza**, Orange County's
ultimate retail wonderland,
features an eclectic range
of shops including the
flagship stores of Prada,
Louis Vuitton, Burberry,
Saint Laurent, and Fendi. It
also offers a range of VIP
services such as concierges
and personal shoppers.
Some allocate multiple days
to shop here.

Rising above **Newport Beach's Fashion Island**neighborhood, **Pendry**

retreat with coastal zest.
Specialty Suites are the top accommodations here, including the Pacific Suite with its sweeping ocean views. The Resort at Pelican Hill, surrounded by 36 holes of golf, has bungalows for privacy and relaxation. Each comes with a patio and private butler service.


Balboa Bay Resort, on the labyrinthine body of water that defines much of Newport Beach, offers rooms with nautical vibes and guests can rent sailboats or get lessons on the channel. Plus, the curated beach picnic is a memorable treat. Nearby, one of The OC's top restaurants, Costa Mesa's Vaca, specializes in Spanish cuisine with Japanese twists.

Step off the sand to delicious resort fare at the exclusive Monarch Bay Beach Club. Or you can follow the swallows to Canyon Villa Estate, a stylish, spiritual retreat above San Juan Capistrano.




DAYS 1 + 2 CARMEL AND MONTEREY

The Monterey Peninsula is the place to begin. Those who've only dipped a toe into the Carmel region may want to focus on coastal Carmel-by-the-Sea, with its galleries, fine dining, and luxury shopping. But don't ignore the region's Tuscany, Carmel Valley.

There, fill your day with yoga, self-enrichment, and golf at the 500-acre **Carmel Valley Ranch**. Spacious suites open to views of the valley, the links, or gardens with local wildlife. The ranch grows most ingredients used to prepare the food served here, as well as the fragrant lavender showcased at its spa.

Across the expanses of **Monterey County**, nearly 200 wineries offer tasting experiences in gorgeous surroundings. The notable grapes of the region include chardonnay and pinot noir, which are poured in most local restaurants.







Memorable eating, with ingredients sourced locally from land and sea, is a hallmark of the region. In Monterey proper, the Monterey Bay Aquarium can easily fill a day with its world-class aquatic displays, from the mesmerizing kelp forest to the ever-lovable sea otters. (The aquarium publishes an essential guide to sustainable seafood, too.) The Sardine Factory recalls the fishing heritage of

Cannery Row and serves inventive seafood dishes.

Along the gracious avenues of Carmel-by-the-Sea, you'll find **Aubergine** and **Chez Noir** (newly Michelinstarred), two restaurants worth reserving well in advance. For coastal lodging, consider the residential-style comforts of the recently opened boutique hotels **Villa Mara Carmel** and **Le Petit Pali at 8th Ave**.

DAYS 3 + 4

BIG SUR

The classic 90-mile drive south on the PCH from Monterey through Big Sur to San Simeon curves between the Santa Lucia Mountains and steep ocean cliffs that frame churning Pacific waters. The region is known for its secluded resorts, where the outdoors blends seamlessly with guests' well-being.

At Alila Ventana Big Sur, supremely comfortable suites seemingly mesh with nature. Those with private hot tubs are particularly dreamy. Or enjoy a room equipped with an oversize hammock and woodburning fireplace. Sit back for the three-hour prixfixe menu in the hotel's Glass House, gazing out from the ocean's edge. An iconic Big Sur resort, the Post Ranch Inn has rooms that offer a range of panoramas-ocean, forest, and mountain. Watching the sun melt into the sea from a glass-walled bungalow or sleeping in a grown-up treehouse with a skylight for stargazing make for unforgettable moments. At night, guests can slip into the infinity pool overlooking the Pacific.







MORE SPECTACULAR STAYS

The Monterey Peninsula features many noteworthy accommodations. Famous for golf and their location along the peninsula, Pebble Beach Resorts offer boutique hotel rooms, private cottages, and apartments between three properties. La Playa Hotel is the briefest of strolls from the beach in Carmel-by-the-Sea. Inland, Bernardus Lodge & Spa in Carmel Valley looks straight out of a Tuscan film, down to the 28 acres of vineyards.

From new green spaces to top-tier art, the charms of the city by the bay—perpetually among the 10 most desirable places to visit the world over—just keep proliferating.





PLENTIFUL PARKS

A top sight spanning the Golden Gate Bridge and Marin Headlands to the north. the Golden Gate National **Recreation Area** repurposes the forested hills of the Presidio, the military base once tasked with quarding the entrance to the bay. Hikes and walks here deliver one wow-worthy view after another. Presidio Tunnel **Tops** is a grand new park that

transformed what was once an open roadway into dense gardens and public spaces with broad vistas. Panoramas sweep from Alcatraz to the open Pacific, and innovative food trucks sell picnic lunches.


Golden Gate Park is another place to revel in the outdoors, and it's better than ever thanks to road closures which make strolling a breeze. Or explore all 3.5 miles of raw Pacific surf and dunes along Ocean Beach.

GETTING TO KNOW SAN FRANCISCO

To really experience the city, you must explore its neighborhoods. Look for taquerias in the Mission, rainbow flags flying above the Castro, earnest hippie vibes in the **Haight**, and beachy quietude in the Sunset. Visitors will find the city welcoming and full of activities for nature lovers, bookworms, shoppers, gourmands, cultural mavens, and more.



WORLD-CLASS ART AND BOUTIQUES

Golden Gate Park offers indoor pleasures as well. Special exhibitions at the striking copper-clad **de** Young Museum are knockouts, including one in 2024 that will tell the story of the city through fashion. And the permanent collection spans old masters to modern art. Afterwards, stroll a few minutes south to 9th Avenue in the prim Inner Sunset neighborhood, home many of the city's best artisanal bakeries such as the renowned Tartine.

For more inspiration, the San Francisco
Museum of Modern
Art has one of the largest public collections of art in the city. Head to Cafe 5 in its fifth-floor sculpture garden for drinks and some of the city's best rooftop views.

San Francisco is

iustly loved for its myriad small shops and boutiques selling goods from the offbeat and hard-tofind to the exquisite. Choice shopping streets include **Haves Street** with its decor, gift, and clothing stores and Chestnut Street in the **Marina**, which is easily combined with bayside walks. Top choices (all with two stars) include: **Hayato**, a haven for Japanese fare near DTLA; **Providence**, the exquisite Hollywood institution of fine dining; **n/naka**, where chef Niki Nakayama melds Japanese and Californian flavors; and **Sushi Ginza Onodera**, the minimalist West Hollywood home to some of LA's best sushi.

A-LIST ACCOMMODATIONS

The Fairmont Century Plaza building has held a storied spot in the City of Angels' history since it opened in the mid-'60s. Designed by Minoru Yamasaki (the architect of the original World Trade Center), it was recently revamped by studio Yabu Pushelberg, adding "more texture, drama, and greater comforts" to the large suites.

The London West Hollywood's personality is one part laid-back Californian, one part British aristocrat. covers an entire city block along the **Sunset Strip**. It's glam from top to bottom, especially in the suites which include arrangements by renowned florists.



NEARBY DESTINATION DINING AND HOTELS

Some 40 miles north of San Diego, the famed **Golden Door** spa retreat in San Marcos is a haven for self-care. Weeklong stays are reserved for women or men, with a few coed weeks a year. Room decor evokes traditional Japanese inns, with shoji doors opening onto the gardens and colorful silk

The Fairmont Grand Del Mar lives up to its name with marble columns, gold-leafed staircases, and hand-stenciled ceilings. Even the 400-acre grounds, with their classical fountains, garden rotundas, and neatly arranged cypresses, are true to this retro Italianate vibe. Other

18-hole Tom Faziodesigned golf course and the Michelin threestar restaurant Addison. Two well-appointed villas are ideal for families and larger groups.

Right on the beach, **L'Auberge Del Mar** is a welcoming enclave with tennis courts, a vast pool, firepits for evening cocktail conviviality, and light-filled suites with patios and balconies. But guests may have a hard time leaving the spa.

bougainvillea vines and hibiscus flowers adorn the Rancho Valencia Resort & Spa in Rancho Santa Fe. The stars here are the resort's 18-court tennis complex and its exquisite spa. Landscaping around the casitas, luxury villas, and private haciendas creates a secret garden feel. Private patios feature fireplaces, hot tubs, or-in the case of the hacienda-a heated pool.

Carlsbad's Park Hyatt Aviara Resort, Golf Club **& Spa** is akin to a retreat in a botanical garden. Its Palm Court is a fantasia of palms, along with orange blossoms, jasmine, hibiscus, and parrot lilies. Book lessons for tennis, volleyball, badminton, and surfing.

THE CITY'S BEST **PLACES TO EAT AND STAY**

A legend of its namesake island, the iconic **Hotel del** Coronado is steeped in Old Hollywood lore (think Some Like It Hot). Its glam style of California dreaming reaches new heights in modern hospitality with the dazzling Shore House at The **Del** on the white sands of the Pacific. The beachfront, residential-style accommodations evoke a private beach house, complemented by cabanas around a zero-edge oceanside pool.

In downtown San Diego, the **Pendry** San Diego brings an elegant touch to the popular nightlife district, the Gaslamp **Ouarter**. Suites. decorated in the hotel's signature blue tartan, serve up views of the city and the bay. Another excellent choice nearby is the **Westgate** Hotel, which offers spacious suites with marble bathrooms. large living areas, and balconies that are ideal for basking in San Diego's yearround balmy breezes. San Diego's food scene is immense,

restaurants are Michelin-honored. And dining is refreshingly casual; dress codes are unknown. Choices worth reserving well ahead include Soichi, a jewel of a Japanese restaurant, and Lola **55**, an innovative Mexican bistro.

Brewing on its namesake island.



While Palm Springs may be the most familiar name, it's actually one of nine distinctive destinations in Greater Palm Springs and the Coachella Valley. **Desert Hot Springs**, Indian Wells, La Quinta, Rancho Mirage, and the area's other communities all have

their own highlights and attractions.

Palm Springs is justifiably renowned for its Mid-Century architecture. A testament to California's longstanding innovative spirit, many of the artful designs began as custom concrete blocks. Palm Springs Mod Squad leads


tours of the very best examples of these lowslung creations, both inside and out. Hear the echoes of long-gone local icons like Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin, Peter Lawford, and even Marilyn Monroe. Private. customized tours can be booked in advance.

Joshua Tree National Park is 45 minutes away by car and filled

landscapes that inspire and fascinate. A great way to see them is on a **Desert Adventures Red Jeep** Tour. Arrange a custom tour that includes the park, Palm Springs' **Indian Canyons, Painted** Canyon, the Mecca Hills, and even the San Andreas Fault.

FROM SHOPPING TO SELF-CARE

The premier retail zone is the EI Paseo Shopping District in Palm Desert. The big names you'd expect and locally owned boutiques abound. Cafés and art galleries complement the many shops.

Look for designer stores like Gucci and Ralph Lauren.

A search for good health has fueled the popularity of the Palm Springs region for decades. Its mineral waters, desert climate,

and naturally occurring fauna are all seen as contributing to wellness. For more than 12.000 years, the water from the Aqua **Caliente Hot Mineral Spring** has flowed deep underground here. The new. expansive Spa at Séc-he features a range of treatments and therapies including massages, facials, scrubs, wraps, couples retreats, and salon services in a variety of baths and saunas gardens, and other spaces.



NEIGHBORHOODS TO EXPLORE

PALM SPRINGS
Downtown and the
Uptown Design District

have many popular restaurants and resorts that range from venerable favorites to gleaming new additions.

PALM DESERT

This city's **El Paseo** rivals **Palm Canyon Drive** as
the Coachella Valley's
best shopping street. The
fascinating **Living Desert Zoo and Gardens** is also
located here.

CATHEDRAL CITY

Family attractions include the **Big League Dreams Sports Park**, where you can play in replicas of beloved baseball parks.

INDIO

The most-populated city of Greater Palm Springs, Indio is famous for the Coachella Valley Arts and Music Festival—or simply Coachella, to many attendees.

RANCHO MIRAGE

The city boasts 17 championship golf courses, with another 83 within 20 miles.



RESPLENDENT RESORTS AND RESTAURANTS

The longestoperating resort in the area. La Quinta Resort & Club is such a landmark that the town was named after it. The Spanish-style, whitewashed buildings include 98 private villas, with 41 temperaturecontrolled pools spread across 45 acres. And in a reaion known for its dozens of golf courses, the resort has five of its own.

Suites at The Ritz-Carlton, Rancho Mirage all include large, private balconies. Those in the tower offer views across the Coachella Valley, and those on the ground level grant easy access to

the vast pool area. Some suites also have firepits, perfect for watching the desert night sky.

Sensei Porcupine Creek is a new wellness resort in Rancho Mirage owned and founded by physician and author Dr. David Agus and Silicon Valley giant Larry Ellison—the site was once the tech magnate's estate. Guests can take an ultra-personalized. science-based approach to wellness under the guidance of accredited experts in the fields of nutrition, rest, and physical therapy.

Capturing the locally beloved Mid-Century vibe is L'Horizon Resort & Spa, a posh and elegant boutique hotel set amidst

desert gardens in Palm Springs proper. Many suites have outdoor showers and there's a private house with its own pool.

Palm Springs has had close Hollywood ties dating back even before the Rat Pack-note the many streets named for bygone stars. Celebrity sightings in restaurants are common too. Barry Manilow is a regular at El Mirasol. for example. Other places worth booking in advance where A-list treatment is standard include Cork & Fork, which serves Californiastyle small plates, and the Colony Club. known for elegant dining since the time of Bogart and Gable.
